The Beauty of New Life

There's something about Spring that brings so much hope and renewal. You look around at the budding flowers, the longer days, the warmer weather, and you begin to see new life all around. The very plants that were brown and appeared dead over winter are bursting with new life, reaching up towards the sun.

All this new life has me thinking, what is hidden dormant within you that can spring forth this season and become a beautiful thing? Unlike flowers, we have to give these hidden treasures a nudge sometimes. In Corinthians, Paul tells us that anyone who is in Christ is a new creation - just like the flowers that appear in the springtime. I encourage you during this season of Lent to look into your soul and gently nudge something within you to burst up through the ground of your life. Try something different in your spiritual life. If you're accustomed to praying on a regular basis and don't do too much studying of the Bible, add that in. Maybe it's practicing centering prayer, or prayer journaling. Take a step out of your normal comfort zone and that might provide the nudge for your flowers—your hidden treasures— to grow.



There will be several different opportunities to worship in this Lenten season and I hope you will join me in inviting God into our lives as we continue to celebrate and commit to the life of Jesus Christ. I'm asking each of you to put on your calendar the services during Holy Week: Palm Sunday (8:45 & 11:00am), Maundy Thursday service (6:30pm), and Easter Sunday (7:30am, 8:45am, & 11:00am). I'm even boldly asking you to potentially say "No" to something else to be with your church family. These services will help complete the picture that began with our Ash Wednesday service and culminate with our Easter celebration. Easter will mean so much more to you as you deepen your faith walk and understanding of the life, death and resurrection of our Lord. I hope you will find time to gather with us during this season of rebirth and new life, as we declare to the world, "Jesus Christ is Risen, indeed!"

boat or a battleship? Is our mindset like the rudder of the USS Alabama, mired in mud, dragging the bottom of the bay? Lord I hope not.



TRUSTEES





Life Line Screening goes beyond regular checkups to look inside your arteries for signs of plaque build-up

Carotid Artery Disease:

An ultrasound is performed to screen Index (ABI) test is the carotid arteries for buildup of fatty plaque.

Peripheral Arterial Disease:

An Ankle-Brachial performed using blood pressure cuffs on the arms and legs.1

Abdominal Aortic Aneurysm:

An ultrasound is performed to screen the abdominal aorta for the presence of an enlargement or aneurysm.

Atrial Fibrillation:

A 6-lead electrocardiogram (EKG) is performed by placing sensors on the arms and legs to screen for irregular heartbeat.

Osteoporosis Risk:

An ultrasound is performed to measure the shin bone for abnormal bone mass density.
