note from the Pastor

There's something sacred about a table.

Not just the altar where we receive Communion-though that table, of course, holds deep and holy meaning. I'm talking, too, about the everyday tables of our lives: kitchen tables, picnic tables, coffee shop tables, and even folding tables in the fellowship hall. These are the places where conversations happen, laughter is shared, burdens are lightened, and lives are woven together.

This month, we begin a new sermon series titled "*Come to the Table*." It's about more than just an invitation to worship- it's a call to embody the radical hospitality of Jesus in every corner of our lives. Throughout the Gospels, Jesus was often found at a table: eating with sinners, blessing the bread, breaking barriers, and making room for the outsider. At Christ's table, no one was turned away.

In that same spirit, we are being invited, not just to come to the table ourselves, but to extend that invitation to others. Who in your life needs a place to belong? Who could use a listening ear or a warm meal? Who might say yes to an invitation, if only they were asked?

As we journey through this series together, I encourage you to think about the tables in your own life.

- Where is God calling you to make room?
- What would it look like to open your heart, your home, or even just your schedule to someone new?

Jesus doesn't just invite us to receive His grace. He calls us to share it. My prayer is that this season would stir in us a fresh sense of purpose and joy as we make space for others at the table-both sacred and ordinary.

Let's come to the table together, and let's not come alone.

As always, we are grateful to everyone who has pitched in and helped out over the last month and we appreciate all your efforts in keeping the facilities well maintained and up to date!






