





Music Notes



On a rainy day in 1849, the tune that we now know for the hymn lyrics of "In the Cross of Christ I Glory," was written by Ithamar Conkey. (Yes, you read that right.) Mr. Conkey set his tune to the well known hymn twenty-four years after the words were written in 1825 by John Bowring. Before Mr. Conkey wrote his tune, the lyrics had been put to another piece of music



Mr Conkey, an organist, was thirty-four years old in 1849, and was having a difficult, rainy day at the Central Baptist Church in Norwich, Connecticut. He had arrived that Sunday morning to a choir attendance of one, a Mrs. Beriah Rathbun. Now the pulpit and the choir loft with the organ were across the sanctuary from each other. After Mr. Conkey played the Prelude, he proceeded to lock the organ; and, without being noticed by the congregation, he promptly left the church and went home! The pastor had been presenting a sermon series on Christ's seven last words. Later in the day, Mr. Conkey sat at his piano thinking about the hymn, "In the Cross of Christ I Glory" and possibly felt somewhat diminished by his actions of the morning. That afternoon he composed the tune that we know as "In the Cross of Christ I Glory" with the lyrics which are familiar to us today. The tune is simply named RATHBUN for the loyal soprano in the choir. Dedication can have its rewards



Carotid Artery Disease:

An ultrasound is performed to screen Index (ABI) test is the carotid arteries for buildup of fatty plaque.

Peripheral Arterial Disease:

An ultrasound is performed to screen the abdominal aorta for the presence of an enlargement or aneurysm.

Atrial Fibrillation:

A 6-lead electrocardiogram (EKG) is performed by placing sensors on the arms and legs to screen for irregular heartbeat.

An ultrasound is performed to measure the shin bone for abnormal bone mass density.
