One of the age-old Methodist questions that often gets tossed around is "How is your soul?" John Wesley, the founder of Methodism, would open every small group meeting with this question. It goes so much deeper than "How are you?" to instead ask "Really, how are you? How is your spirit?"

I'll be the first to admit this question can be very jarring, because it calls for an intimate response. Even if we just ask the question of ourselves, sometimes we may not like the answer that we have to give. Maybe your life is falling apart but you feel God's peace and presence in ways like you never have before. Or maybe your life may be going great, but your soul may feel like a dry cistern.

By examining this question in our own life, we must analyze our lives and our habits. We must ask ourselves the hard questions, like:

- What are the things I'm doing in my life that really make my soul come alive and flourish?
- What are the things I'm engaged in that are draining the life out of my soul?
- What am I doing to bring my soul closer to God?
- What am I doing that is creating distance between God and myself?

With these answers, there doesn't need to be a sense of judgement or shame. Open your Bible to the book of Psalms and you will read the wide variety of emotions David brings before God. Regardless of what season of life you may be in, this question serves as a reminder that it's okay to be human. It's more than okay to admit there are times when our souls are not doing well. God wants us to bring our honest selves. There is nothing

we can say or do to shock God, as God knows our innermost being. God wants us to be honest, to bring our entire being. And on those days when the journey seems long and your soul feels twisted, tied, and dried up, that's why God has us in community— to bear one another's burdens, to encourage one another along, to walk with one another.

Maybe you need to reflect on the question. Or maybe you can help someone by asking "how is your soul" and truly listening to their response.

IMPACT is a youth service event open to middle and senior high youth groups that offers an opportunity to serve the community as the hands and feet of Christ. This year's IMPACT will be based in Newnan and projects are expected to include:

- 1. Building a duplex home in the Chalk Level neighborhood in Newnan
- 2. Working on tornado recovery projects in areas that were affected by the storms in 2021
- 3. Build/repair projects for local homeowners in need (wheelchair ramps, exterior painting etc.)
- 4. Assisting other local nonprofits as they serve those in need in the community


