Dare to Prepare


The theme for youth this year is DARE TO PREPARE. As we dare to prepare our hearts, we take a look at the Gospel of Matthew. In Chapter 13 of Matthew we are introduced to the parable of the sower.

1 That same day Jesus went out of the house and sat beside the sea. 2 Such great crowds gathered around him that he got into a boat and sat there, while the whole crowd stood on the beach. 3 And he told them many things in parables, saying: "Listen! A sower went out to sow. 4 And as he sowed, some seeds fell on the path, and the birds came and ate them up. 5 Other seeds fell on rocky ground, where they did not have much soil, and they sprang up quickly, since they had no depth of soil. 6 But when the sun rose, they were scorched; and since they had no root, they withered away. 7 Other seeds fell among thorns, and the thorns grew up and choked them. 8 Other seeds fell on good soil and brought forth grain, some a hundredfold, some sixty, some thirty. 9 Let anyone with ears listen!" Matthew 13:1-9

Our hearts are like soil; in order for soil to grow fruited plants, it must first be tilled and prepared. We must cultivate our hearts with the Word and water ourselves in faith in order to produce ripe fruits of the Spirit.

We must prepare our hearts to serve God and serve others.

Missions and Outreach

Altar Rail Offerings for the month of October are for Aldersgate and Camp Collinswood!

Aldersgate Homes is a related agency of the North Georgia conference. Their mission is to assist persons with special needs to lead productive lives by assisting them with residential and recreational alternatives, enhancing their quality of life as they become community

participants. They help the residents to be welcomed by their congregations and to participate

in church related activities, to connect with friends and mentors, to participate in the life of the community, to enjoy retreat and recreation in God's great outdoors, and to live as independently as their capabilities allow.

Their "Welcome Home Ministry" provides apartments for persons with disabilities to allow them to live fairly independently with support. The residents are placed in apartments in proximity to their families. Aldersgate assists with paying the bills, negotiating rent and services with the apartment management, and such needs. The residents are connected with Best Buddies (a nationwide organization on college campuses encouraging young people to get involved with persons with developmental disabilities). They are connected with organizations at Agnes Scott, Emory, and GA Tech.

In addition, Camp Collinswood is a special, non-residential part of Aldersgate. Camp Collinswood is located on 27 acres fronting on Lake Oconee and offers a place of rest, retreat, and recreation for all people, especially those with mobility issues. In Summer 2023, Aldersgate plans to create an inclusive day camp at Collinswood.



Any and all donations are greatly appreciated and go a long way in supporting the ministries of Aldersgate/Camp Collinswood.


